Pool Safety

Pool use will slow down during the cool months, but we should continue to follow safety rules.

- Please make sure children are supervised at all times.
- Even older kids and adults should not swim alone. Accidents can happen to anyone and having another person present can be life saving.
- Please do not consume beverages while in the pool.
- A good swim after a hard days work can be very refreshing, but please make use of the shower first. Dirt, sweat and oil from your body can mess up the pool chemistry and cause a pool shutdown.

Activity concerns

A few activities have caused concern and are listed here:

- Our picnic tables have continued to be damaged by teens using them to jump on, thus bending the tables. Lawn furniture has also been damaged in this fashion.
- If you are going to bring your baby in the pool, please use the proper diaper cover to insure that they do not leak in the pool. Not following this procedure can cause fecal contamination and thus a pool shutdown.
- It has come to our attention that the parking lot and pool restrooms have been used as teen "parking" areas. It is not our attention to monitor or police this activity, but parents should be aware of this activity for the safety of their kids.

Our children are our most precious commodity. Let's keep them safe. Please instruct your kids to observe park rules and to be safe. Laurel, and the rest of our playground committee have been working hard to raise money to improve our play-ground equipment. Their efforts have been very successful and new equipment has arrived. A revitalization of our playground area is scheduled for next year.
